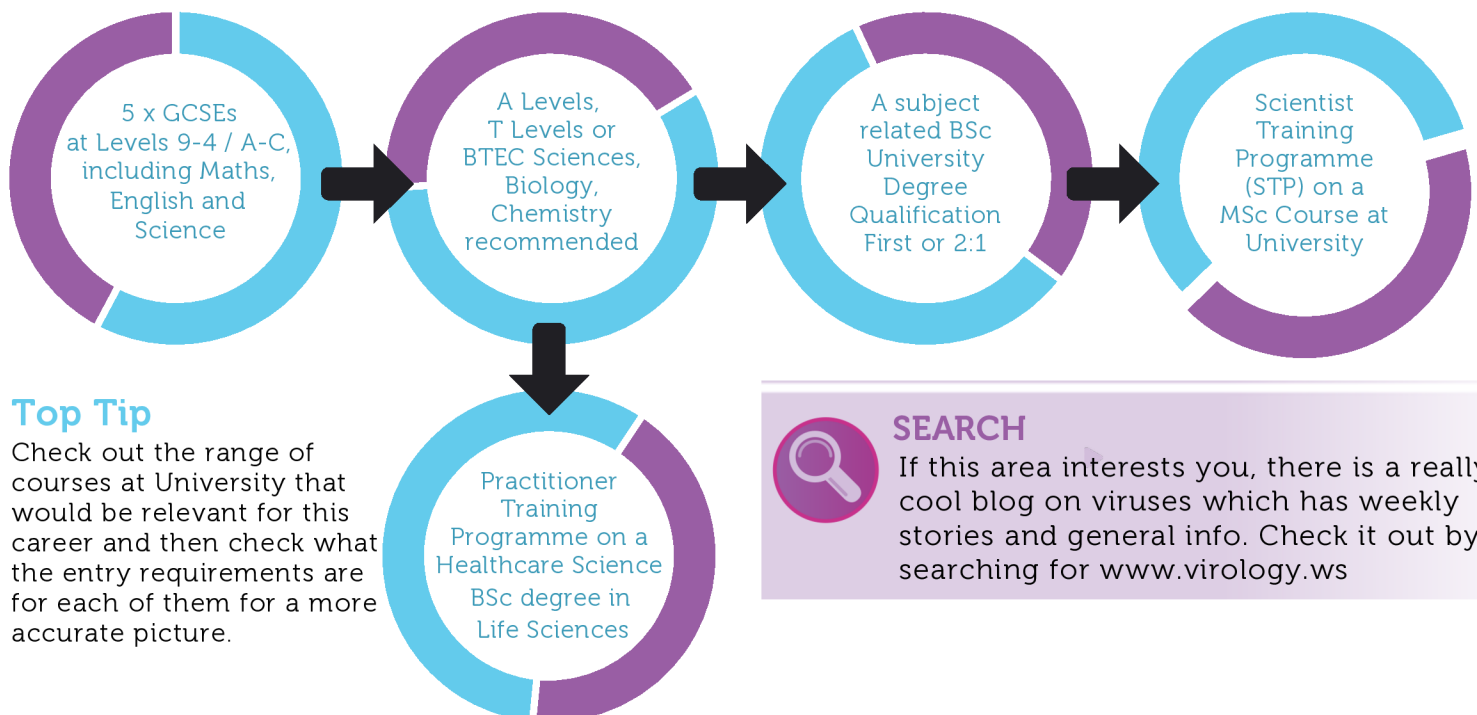


The range of diseases they are involved with range from the flu to HIV.
